- 1) Adriano Celentano is an Italian musician, singer, composer, actor, and filmmaker. He is dubbed il Molleggiato because of his dancing. Celentano's many albums frequently enjoyed both commercial and critical success. With 150 million records sold worldwide, he is one of the best-selling Italian musical artists.
- 2) Paris and Versailles are must-see destinations for a first trip to France. Other classic travel itineraries include stops at fashionable seaside resorts, fairy-tale castles, and glorious Gothic cathedrals. - 7) Via San Lorenzo is not far from Palazzo San Giorgio and it links the Porto Antico area to Piazza Ferrari. Halfway up the street there is the Majestic cathedral, a masterpiece of Gothic art built on a pre-existing Romanesque structure with black and white stone stripes. Via San Lorenzo leads to Piazza Matteotti where we can admire the imposing neoclassical facade of Palazzo Ducale. In this square the Church of Gesù contains paintings by Rubens and Guido Reni.

- 8) Niagara falls is one of the most famous tourist attractions in the world. It receives 20 million visitors annually. It is a natural phenomenon, but its commercial attractions make it much more than that. It is easy to reach by all means of transport. It is important to remember that there is Niagara Falls, Ontario, on the Canadian side, and Niagara Falls, NY on the American side.
